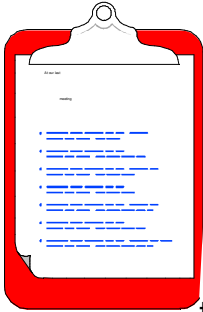

Jack asked all operators to monitor the input frequency and to swing beams to try to triangulate the interference. All verifiable reports should be e-mailed to him and he will keep a log.

Field Day: Things are still on target for Lake Darpo on June 27 & 28th. We will try to get donations of food from several local restaurants but the club voted to spend up to \$200 for food and supplies if needed. We should have use of the FT100D from McLeod Hospital and we plan to put up the Yagi and the MFJ 6-Meter antennas. We will need fans and ice. We also discussed using FRS radios for communications between stations.

New Business:

H.R. 2160: 111th Congress

2009-2010 Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Enhancement Act of 2009 was sponsored by Rep. Sheila Jackson-Lee [D-TX] on April 29 with the following purpose:



To promote and encourage the valuable public service, disaster relief, and emergency communications provided on a volunteer basis by licensees of the Federal Communications Commission in the Amateur Radio Service, by undertaking a study of the uses of amateur radio for emergency and disaster relief communications, by identifying unnecessary or unreasonable impediments to the deployment of Amateur Radio emergency and disaster relief communications, and by making recommendations for relief of such unreasonable restrictions so as to expand the uses of amateur radio communications in Homeland Security planning and response.

This bill will probably never get out of committee but it is nice to see that someone in Washington values our services.

SC HEART will be holding another Technician Training session at McLeod Hospital in July. More information at the next meeting.

McLeod Repeaters N4DOU reported that the repeaters to be installed at McLeod Hospital are now in Newberry and will be installed very soon. The first will be installed on the Florence campus followed by Darlington and Dillon.
